

Gadsden awarded \$114,000 for command center

The City of Gadsden announced that it has been awarded a \$114,000 grant from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to purchase a state-of-theart mobile command center.

This funding will enhance the city's ability to respond to emergencies, manage large-scale incidents and coordinate efforts across multiple agencies in realtime, ensuring the safety and security of the community.

to the Department of Homeland Security for their continued support of our efforts to improve public safety in Gadsden and our Emergency Management Department," said Gadsden Mayor Craig Ford. "This grant is critical in enhancing our ability to respond to emergencies swiftly and effectively."

"We are extremely grateful Derek Mummert and Deputy Director Marc Golden played a pivotal role in securing this \$114,000 grant, according to Michael Rodgers, City of Gads-

den's Public Affairs Coordinator. "Being awarded this grant highlights their persistence and dedication to improving local emergency response operations," Rodgers said.

The mobile command center will be equipped with cuttingedge communications technology and equipment, allowing city officials, first responders and emergency management teams to operate efficiently during disasters or critical events.

The command trailer will be fully operational during natural disasters, public safety emergencies and large public gatherings, providing a vital mobile hub for coordinating responses and managing resources.

"The mobile command center will give our first responders and emergency management teams the tools they need to protect our citizens, ensure timely communications, and help maintain order in times of crisis," Ford said.

The mobile command center is expected to be operational by mid-2025 and will serve in both routine operations and times of heightened public safety concerns.

Attalla to receive \$500k CDBG grant for sewer pipe upgrades

Attalla will receive \$500,000 of a \$17 million-dollar Community Development Block Grants to upgrade the city's sewer system by replacing damaged terracotta (clay) pipes and manholes. Improvements will be conducted in

two areas of the city. Governor Kay Ivey awarded the grants to provide infrastructure improvements in 41 Alabama towns, cities and counties. The grants cover a range of community needs including water and sewer upgrades, street resurfacing, fire

station construction and fire trucks and upgrading parks. "Probably no other grant program in Alabama has as widespread an impact or is as celebrated as Community Development Block Grants,' said Ivey. "These grants help local governments take on much-needed projects that make communities safer and better places to live. I am honored to award these grants that will help so many communities across our state."

The Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs administers the grants with funds provided by the

U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. AD-ECA administers a wide range of programs that support law enforcement, victim assistance programs, economic development, water resource management, energy conservation and recreation.

"The Community Development Block Grant Program is a competitive process in which local governments examine their most pressing needs and submit applications," said ADECA Director Kenneth Boswell said. "ADECA is pleased to join Governor Ivey in awarding these grants for projects that will improve the quality of life in these 41 communities. While there are simply not enough funds to award a grant for every project submitted, all applicants should be commended for their dedication to serving their communities.'

Community Development Block Grants are awarded annually in several categories to ensure local governments of all sizes have opportunities to be awarded funds. Categories include Small City (populations of 3,000 and below), Large City (populations of 3,001 and above), County (supporting primarily unincorporated areas), Community Enhancement (special projects extending beyond infrastructure improvements) and Planning Fund (projects that enable governments to map out goals and long-range plans).

John S. Jones student wins statewide reading competition

The Alabama Education Association (AEA) this week announced its 2024 annual "Be a Champion and Read" contest winners.

AEA's Be a Champion and Read contest is a statewide reading competition that has included over half a million student participants representing every school district in Alabama.

Alabama public school K-6 students are challenged to read six appropriate reading-level books to qualify for the grand prize. There are two winners of this competition each year, one being an Auburn fan, and one being an Alabama fan. The grand prize for the award winners is to attend the Iron Bowl with two guests, which includes sideline passes and pre-game activities.

The winner for Team Auburn was

4th grader Lily Hindsman from John S. Jones Elementary School in Rainbow City and the winner of the Team Alabama award was Jordan May, a 2nd grader from University Charter School in Livingston.

Both students were informed that they won the contest in a surprise announcement in front of their classmates in assemblies at their schools. Hindsman was given her award by Auburn's mascot, Aubie, and Jordan was given her award by Alabama's mascot, Big

Aubie also presented Lily with a signed autograph from Hugh Freeze and tickets and sideline passes to the Iron Bowl.

This year alone, over 27,000 students entered the competition as contestants, a testament to AEA's commitment to encouraging reading for Alabama's youth.

"This contest has shown yet again that tens of thousands of Alabama elementary school students are fired up and excited to read," said AEA President Dr. Susan Williams Brown. "Reading is a crucial building block for all other learning, which is why AEA established the Be a Champion and Read contest in 2011 to motivate young students to develop a love of reading.'

This marks the eleventh year AEA has sponsored the contest. AEA is also launching its inaugural Be a Champion and Count contest to encourage students to sharpen their math skills. Winners of this competition will receive tickets to the Alabama vs. Auburn basketball games in 2025.



GRMC warns of knowing the difference between heart attack and heartburn

As Thanksgiving and other holidays approach, many Americans look forward to all of the festivities, spending time with family and friends and indulging in traditional holiday dishes. But what many people don't know is that during the holiday season there may also be a higher risk of two health conditions – heartburn and heart attack.

"These conditions are not the same and not related, but sometimes they can be hard to tell apart," said Sawan Jalnapurkar, M.D., a Gadsden Regional Medical Center affiliated interventional cardiologist. "Heart attacks are more likely to feel like pain, pressure or a tight squeezing feeling in your chest. Heartburn feels more like a burning sensation and can cause a bitter or sour taste to travel to

your mouth."
Heartburn is very com-

mon and can be avoided. In fact, the American Gastroenterological Association estimates that more than 60 million Americans experience it at least once a month. Rich holiday meals, overeating and drinking alcohol can trigger heartburn, making it even more common during holiday periods. Dr. Jalnapurkar shares tips to help prevent the discomfort of holiday heartburn.

• Eat smaller, balanced meals to avoid overloading your digestive system.

• Avoid spicy foods and choose low-fat, low-acid ingredients to reduce heart-burn triggers.

Stay hydrated with water and avoid alcohol consumption.

 Don't like down after a big meal. Instead, take a walk to stimulate digestion and reduce blood pressure.

• Manage symptoms with

over-the-counter medications that usually bring fast relief.

"We want people to enjoy the holidays and not to feel sick," said Dr. Jalnapurkur. "It's all about knowing how to stay well in the first place and finding that sweet spot between overindulgence and moderation."

If heartburn does not subside or becomes more frequent, it's important to talk to a gastroenterologist. Ongoing heartburn is one of the most common symptoms of GERD (Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease), which can result in more serious complications if left untreated.

Heart attacks also occur more frequently during the winter holidays, especially on Christmas day and during the last week of the year. The holidays can be a stressful time. Normal routines are often disrupted. People get busy and tend to sleep less. They are likely to eat and drink more. Winter weather can also lead to constricted vessels caused by cold temperatures, resulting in restricted blood flow in the body.

Heart attack symptoms can include tightness, discomfort or pain in the chest. Pain may also be felt in the jaw, neck, arm or back. Other signs include shortness of breath, lightheadedness, dizziness, nausea and vomiting.

"Don't ignore the warning signs of a heart attack because you are afraid of spoiling the holidays," said Dr. Jalnapurkar. "Fast care is critical. During a heart attack, the heart's tissue is damaged and that can happen very quickly. Fast medical treatment can be the difference between life and death."



The Vagabond - Jehu W. Vandiver left his mark on Gadsden



Last week The Vagabond mentioned Jehu Wellington Vandiver as one of those states, both north and south. persons opposed to the so-called gambling marriages that the City of Gadsden allowed in the 1880s. One of the most interesting

Born at Alexandria on September 17, 1850, Vandiver moved with his parents to Talladega as a young child. After completing a course in the town's public schools, he began the study of law in the offices of Bradford & Martin. Vandiver was admitted to the bar in 1872 and was quite successful. For around eight years he was on the lecture circuit, appearing in a number of

Vandiver was married June 4, 1878, to Miss Florence Cunningham of Gadsden, the daughter of Captain J.L. Cunningham. The couple's home was located at Walnut and Fifth Streets but eventually was moved back to front on Chestnut Street, leaving a triangle at the corner. The couple had three children - Almuth, William Reeves and An-

When Cherokee County celebrated the one hundredth anniversary of its creation as a county in 1936, Florence Cunningham Vandiver was chosen to represent a belle of the Old South in the parade and other festivities.

After working as a reporter at the Birmingham Ledger, Jehu Vandiver went to New York, where he made quite a reputation as a staff writer for the New York Times. He later became grand jury clerk in the office of the district attorney.

Five Republicans, two Democrats will represent Alabama in D.C.

The 45th U.S. President, Donald J. Trump, was elected as the 47th U.S. President on November 5. Under the Electoral College system, the president is elected not by popular vote, but by a system where each state casts the same number of votes as they have representatives and senators in the U.S. Congress. We in Alabama have seven congressmen and two senators. Therefore, we have nine electoral votes.

National voters and the media knew that there were seven pivotal battleground states that would determine the outcome of the presidential race: Georgia and North Carolina in the south (both with 16 electoral votes, pretty good prizes), Arizona and Nevada in the West and the ultimate battleground Rust Belt states of Wisconsin, Michigan and Pennsylvania in the Midwest. There were all kinds of formulas and scenarios as to how these states would fall and which ones Trump or his Democratic opponent, Vice-President Kamala Harris, would win. Polls revealed all seven states were showing dead even contests leading up to the election. According to all polls, no winner could be projected. Not even the Las Vegas oddsmakers could predict a clear

Trump won all seven of the battleground states, including the Blue Wall Big Three of Michigan, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin. It was like a giant red wave that swept those three pivotal states, as well as every red state, which was the vast majority of the rest of the country.





Seeing the world with new eyes

This weekend, our family is going to the beach. We have made this a family tradition and we look forward to it every November. The weather will be cool, the beaches will be mostly empty and our girls will have a great time looking for shells, interesting pieces of driftwood and sundry other pieces of ocean detritus.

I love this trip for several reasons. One of my favorite parts of going to the beach is the simultaneous sensory overload and deprivation. Sitting on the beach, the wind blowing in my ears and face, the water and sky reaching out as far as I can see is a sensory experience akin to existing in the white noise I like to listen to when working. It also drowns out any bickering and tattle-telling, and I can just smile and nod and continue enjoying the scenery.

Another part of this trip I really look forward to is visiting the Gulf Specimen Aquarium in Panacea, Fla. It is very small, and the buildings are a kind of patchwork of touch tanks, rescue pools and observation spaces. with sea squirts, sea poppies, urchins and other water creatures I can pick up and interact with. Last year, I saw the tiniest puffer fish in the observation room, and my girls had fun making faces at a tank of a bulbous-headed fish that gives bombastic side-eye.

When we make this trip, we stay at a cozy AirBnB, cook our meals at home and play card games in the evenings. During the day, we explore the beaches and small communities along the shore. These are my favorite treasure hunts — we always find a new shop or restaurant or park we missed the year before. In a way, it is a new trip each time we go. We are visiting the same cities and towns but finding hidden treasures on each new exploration. As Proust puts it, "The real voyage of discovery consists not in seeking new landscapes, but in having new eyes.

This way of seeing is a trick I try to remind myself to try out regularly at home, too. Whether I am driving across town, working at home or going for a walk, intentionally having "new eyes" leads to all kinds of fresh discoveries. Changes in weather, seasons and place often help us see our surroundings and loved ones with new eyes.

This past week, the girls and I went on several walks, taking pictures of the scenery. The fall colors, the sunsets and the clear bright skies were beautiful. Then, we finally had a solid day of much needed rain. On our way home after school, the girls and I took the same roads we often travel, and I pointed out how much brighter the leaves are against the grey sky and darker, rain-soaked tree trunks. Several times, they asked me to slow down, pull over and roll down their windows so they could take pictures. They'd been down the same roads all week, but the change in weather let them see their surroundings with new perspectives.

While packing for our trips, I often find myself sighing over all the work a vacation is. We will have fun, but I know everyone will be more than ready to come home by the last day. Sometimes the work of making a vacation happen makes me wonder why we leave in the first place, but besides the memories and new explorations, one of the best parts of traveling is coming home with new eyes.



When we return, it will be time to start our Christmas season, visit the Falls and look at the lights and animal habitats with family. We will put up a Christmas tree and settle in for the cozy season. As we do, it will be an opportunity to see our home, the past year, each other and future plans with new eyes — and plan our next voyage of discovery.




Brunswick Stew and Creamy Chicken and Wild Rice Soup

Brunswick Stew 1 3.5 pound Pork Butt 1 4-pound whole chicken 3 gallons water 2 cups diced peeled potatoes 2 teaspoons salt 1 teaspoon black pepper ½ teaspoon garlic powder ½ teaspoon cayenne pepper 2 beef bouillon cubes 1 cup diced onions 1 10-ounce package frozen baby lima beans 1 10-ounce package frozen corn 2 28-ounce cans crushed tomatoes ½ cup ketchup 1 tablespoon yellow mustard 1 tablespoon brown sugar 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce

1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice

Place the pork and chicken in a large stockpot with the water and bring to boil on medium heat. Reduce heat and boil slightly for three hours or until tender. When cool enough to handle the meat, remove fat and chop meat into small pieces. Measure 10 cups of stock and pour into a medium pot. Add the diced potatoes, salt, black pepper, garlic powder, cayenne pepper and beef bouillon to the pot. Bring to a boil. Cook for 10 minutes, then add the onions and corn to the pot. Cook until the potatoes and onions are done. Reduce the heat and add the meat, crushed tomatoes, ketchup, mustard, brown sugar, Worcestershire and frequently.


