Local judges Brynn Crain and Matt Skelton sworn in

A pair of local judges had their investiture ceremonies on Tuesday, Jan. 21 at the William H. Rhea III Judicial Building in Gadsden.

Brynn Crain was sworn in as Etowah County Circuit Judge Place No. 2, while Matt Skelton was sworn in as Etowah County District Judge Place No. 2.

"You never get anywhere in your life by yourself," said Crain. "You get there because it's God's will and you get there

because of the people He put into your life to help you out. So many people have supported me and encouraged me over the years - colleagues, mentors, friends, family and educators. They taught me how to be a better lawyer and how to be a better person. In this job, you must make difficult decisions that affects people's lives, and that fact is not lost on me. I can't promise that everyone will be happy with the decisions I make, but what I can promise you is that if you come before this court, you're going to be treated fairly and be treated with respect. This will be

a court of integrity that will inspire confidence in the people of this county."

Crain succeeds Billy Ogletree, while Skelton replaces Will Clay. Both places are in the 16th Judicial Circuit of the State of Alabama.

"I look forward to working with everybody here," said Skelton. "I realize it's going to be a learning curve for me, so as Judge Nabors said, I ask everybody to pray. I feel that everybody who works in the building is here for a specific reason. We're a team, and I'm proud and happy to be the newest member of the team.

I look forward to working with each and every one of you.

Crain served as Etowah County Deputy District Attorney for the past several years, while Skelton was a partner in Inzer, Haney, McWhorter, Haney & Skelton for the past 15 years. Both expressed thanks to the Etowah County Women's Republican Club for its support.

"Today is a historic day, because we have the opportunity to witness the investitures of Brynn Crain and Matt Skelton and celebrate the continuity of the rule of law that brings us together," said Etowah County Presiding Circuit Judge George Day. "All of us recognize that to achieve justice, more than just a knowledge of the law is required. In the first Book of Kings, we find the words of Solomon when he knew that he would succeed his father David as King of Israel, and Solomon asked God for a wise and discerning heart.

"So, our prayer today is for Brynn and Matt and all judges in that they will always seek not only knowledge of the law but wisdom to interpret the law and apply it justly to the cases that come before them, a wisdom that only God can give."

The YMCA remains active under our new motto, "Y Without Walls," which reflects our commitment to reaching beyond a single location and serving more than 14 locations across Etowah

The National YMCA emphasizes in its mission statement that, "The YMCA aims to improve our nation's health by providing programs and activities that promote overall well-being, no matter where you are on your journey toward better health. The future success of children and teens is fostered by caring adults who help them feel confident, secure, imaginative and empowered in the present. That is why Y staff and volunteers are also mentors and role models, sharing a part of this important and inspiring responsibility in helping everyone to realize who they are and what they are capable of achieving.

The YMCA of Coosa Valley focuses on teaching healthy living to children in our communities through our afterschool and summer programs. Afterschool programs include childcare, tutoring and mentoring along with physical activities. We work to ensure that lunches and snacks provided are healthy and nutritious. We remind parents the importance of offering their children opportunities to make healthy choices at home.

Y Without Walls offers water safety that includes swim lessons, lifeguard classes and how to be safe around water. In the spring and summer of 2024, the Safety around Water class was taught to nearly 2,000 youths.

Goleman identifies five components of EI that contribute to personal success and well-

Self-awareness: Understanding our own emotions.

Self-regulation: Managing and controlling our reactions to emotions.

Internal motivation: Recognizing what is truly important in life.

Empathy: Understanding the emotions of others.

Social skills: Building and maintaining social connections.

"Emotional Intelligence is the ability to perceive, analyze and control your emotions appropriately," said Maymunah Y. Kadiri, M.D. "A child with a good EI can empathize with others and may have good communication, decision-making and problem-solving skills. Emotionally intelligent children can also understand others better and keep a level head in difficult situations."

Children with a good EI are better at maintaining current relationships and establishing new friendships with other kids and better at controlling negative thoughts and emotions, which in turn helps them manage stressful situations and environments. Negative emotions such as anger, sadness, jealousy and disappointment hinder a child's ability to think and function. This not only causes a child to struggle in social functions and activities but can have a great impact on how he or she performs in a classroom. When children possess the ability to control their emotions, they are able to maintain focus on the task at hand. A higher EI leads to a higher IQ.

In today's world, young people face numerous challenges, making it difficult to navigate and overcome obstacles. The YMCA of the Coosa Valley has developed programs to help students lead healthy and balanced lives. By fostering emotional health, we empower kids not just to survive but to thrive.

19th century downtown storefronts in Gadsden




Many of the buildings on Broad Street in downtown Gadsden date as far back as 1883 and have not changed since that time. There are exceptions. The first brick store built in the city in 1874 today has a glass front.

In the 1880s and 1890s, downtown merchants did not go for attractive show windows, and windows displays were few and far between. Some storefronts used dummies to display men's apparel, including shirts, collars, ties, vests and coats. The dummies were put out on the sidewalk and were blown down by every stiff wind unless tied to a post.

Photographs of that period show some mens and boys suits buttoned around wooden crosses hanging near the front doors. The store windows were built for light purposes only, and all of them featured several panes.

Plate glass storefronts came into style in the late 1890s, and to it required some re-

modeling to install them. Gradually, all of the for the display of merchandise. Solid blinds downtown stores fell into line until the old fashion fronts became obsolete.

In the 1870s and 1880s, most downtown stores were small one-story frame structures with the familiar peaked roof and false front. The buildings' small windows were not used were bolted over the windows at night, and the interiors were sealed almost airtight. All of the rear windows featured steel bars.

All displays were on the sidewalk and were apt to include plow gear, hams, horse collars, trace chains, cheese hoops filled with German millet seed, hoes, ax handles, well rope, tallow and beeswax cakes, kindling, ginseng, sassafras roots, plow stocks, grindstones, bales of thread, garden seed, heel bolts and

Perhaps you can relate to the following true story. My mother used to read a magazine called True Story, which I would grab it the minute she was through with. It. If we lose our song, we will find it

The other day, a friend at work told me that she'd read an article about how mourning doves stopped singing in many places back in 2021. The birds were still there, they were just silent. Many ornithologists and amateur birdwatchers noticed this strange phenomenon, and as I read more about it, I really empathized with the disconcerting sense of loss many of them described. This loss is not as simple as just missing the sounds the birds make. Instead, the loss of the doves' song was a loss of place and time identity for some. A couple of people mentioned that they connected the sounds of mourning doves with the identity of where they live, and the absence of the sound has altered their perception of place. Another writer mentioned the sound instantly transporting him back in time to childhood visits with a family member. The loss of the birdsong for him represented a loosening — and perhaps loss — of those memories.

Mourning the loss of this familiar sound, then, is mourning the loss of the expected, of the comfort of the patterns of daily life, and of the memories attached to the sound. We are wired to recognize patterns. We use patterns as tools to communicate, to stay safe and to express ourselves. Vocal patterns allow us to learn speech. Visual patterns form the basis of communicating through writing. The ability to leverage pattern recognition is a powerful tool for writers, artists and musicians.

One incredibly popular and accomplished singer-songwriter skillfully wields this tool as a literary device called "allusion." This artist recognizes patterns in her life experiences and relationships, but also in literature, and has crafted songs that allude to the poetry of Sylvia Plath, Robert Frost and Pablo Neruda, as well as the novels of F. Scott Fitzgerald and Daphne du Maurier. These poets and writers were also recognizing and building on archetypal patterns that existed long before they did. When readers and listeners who are familiar with these patterns recognize them, new levels of patternicity and connection are created, often in powerful ways.

In creative writing class this week, we discussed the ways references to archetypes and mythology, folktales and pop culture can create meaning, connection, identity and community. The ability to recognize these patterns and connections functions as a kind of bridge between individuals as we each navigate our unique circumstances and experiences. These bridges allow for empathy, which makes compassion pos-

Compassion can be defined as: "recognizing the suffering of others and then taking action to help; or as a tangible expression of love for those who are suffering or in need." Sometimes, though, we need the loss of our expected patterns to jolt us out of autopilot and remind us to pay attention.

At least a couple mornings a week, I grab breakfast in the Gadsden State cafeteria and spend a little time writing. This week, I kept thinking about the mourning doves how they are still present but have lost their song. I was pondering this when I went in for breakfast one morning. Breakfast was what I expected, and I happily gathered my tray and drink. My usual seat was open, and the same news channel was playing as always. As I sat down, I was still thinking about the doves and patterns and noticing how much I subconsciously rely on my own daily patterns without always thinking about how much they are intertwined with



the routines and patterns of others.

I found a more recent article that observed that in most places, the doves have begun to sing again. Knowing that even the birds stop singing sometimes is disconcerting, but it is also comforting to know that humans aren't the only ones so deeply connected to routine and patterns. It's also comforting to know that if we lose our song we will find it again.



Singing the broken heart song in reverse

The song "The Night We Met" by Lord Huron, which is about losing someone you love, includes a line that stopped me cold: "I had all, and then most of you, some, and now none of you.'

When first I heard that line, it registered deeply as one of those "heart cries." What a difficult and true lyric! Whether you lose someone suddenly or they slip away slowly, it is a measured loss that comes in pieces and parts. "All of you," that joyful time of newness and fullness; followed by "most of you," the first big challenge that can bring division; followed by "some of you," when something is desperately wrong and it is unsure how this will go; followed by "none of you," the ending filled with remorse.

Even if the loss was a long time ago, the memories slowly fade until you can no longer quite remember the inflection of their voice or their smell or their laugh. We've all lived long enough to know the pain of loss, and sometimes with such a great loss, the question arises of, "What

Another line from the song is, "Take me back to the night we met so that I can tell myself not to ride along with you." What a sentiment coming from a broken heart! We might also say, "please, please, please take me back in time so I would have never loved you and never followed you and never suffered this loss!"

It is during this moment when facing such a severe a level of pain that we think to ourselves, "Was it worth it? Why did I have to commit? Why did you overtake me just to waste me? Why did our pieces fit together so perfectly, just to break me into pieces with grief? Why, why, why?" Do you know that feeling? Jesus does. His Blessed Mother does. His Apostles

Imagine the agony of the Apostles as they hid all day on Saturday after the Crucifixion of our Lord. Did they remember to themselves how Phillip and Andrew were just fine in following John the Baptist before Jesus came along (John 1:38-40), and now this? Did they remember to themselves how Andrew, along with Peter, James and John, had a thriving fishing business before Jesus (Luke 5:10) and now they all huddled in fear for their lives?

Matthew was rich and comfortable. Nathaniel (Bartholomew), who was well respected as a "model Jew" and "man of integrity," now hid like a dog avoiding the pound. He had finally accepted that something good "can come from Nazareth" (John 1:43-51), but nothing good came from it in the end. All of the Apostles felt a loss too great for words - abandonment, fear, grief and sorrow.

And what about our Blessed Mother? Mary had long known that in the end her promised Son of God would be "spoken against" and would cause such a division that it would cause "the rise and fall of many" (Luke 2:25-35). She who had born witness to all the Joyful Mysteries as the "God-bearer" had pondered long in her heart the painful prophecy against her that "a sword will pierce through your own soul also" (verse 35). As the sward pierced the heart of God, letting blood and water flow, it pierced the soul of His mother as the mission of cooperating with God, for



salvation met a brutal end.

In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus experienced the exceptionally rare condition of hemosiderosis, when His "sweat became like drops of blood" (Luke 22:44). Though in "agony" (not regret), "the Firstborn over all creation" (Colossians 1:15), since the first moment He began creation (John 1:3),

God knew what salvation would require. And in the moments before the sacrifice was to begin, seeing "the cup" in full measure (Matthew 26:39), hearing all of creation's broken heart song (Romans 8:22-23), our Lord, the "Man of Sorrows," becomes "acquainted with grief" (Isaiah 53:3) so that we can sing the broken heart song in reverse. That those having "none of Him" by grace working through faith

can have "all of Him." Yes, the very hope of our faith is that we grow in grace until "none" becomes "some" and "most" becomes "all" of Him.

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





(b) The drug enforcement unit may require the owner to pay a pro rata share of the costs, if any, of publication of notice of the sale of the property.

Section 5. (a) If abandoned or stolen property is sold under this act, the proceeds of the sale shall be held in a separate account for a period of six months for the owner.

(b) During the sixmonth period described in subsection (a), upon demand by the owner and submission of sufficient proof of ownership, the drug enforcement unit shall pay to the owner the proceeds of the sale, less any cost of recovery, storage, maintenance, and sale of the property. (c) If the proceeds are

not claimed within six months, after deducting and paying all expenses incurred in the recovery, storage, maintenance, and sale of the property, the net proceeds shall be paid to the Drug Enforcement Forfeiture Account in the county treasury. The funds in the account may be expended based on vouchers submitted to the county and shall be used solely for law enforcement purposes. The receipts and expenditures of funds shall be audited by the Examiners of Public Accounts. Section 6. If aban-





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
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
